This model regulation reflects guidance and feedback from local and statewide experts and research from relevant published works, including strategies for buffer implementation, buffer effectiveness, buffer widths, and buffer functions. The model recommends a minimum drinking water quality buffer but also considers landscape level and site-specific criteria to increase the minimum buffer, when appropriate, to protect water quality.

All NH municipalities and stakeholders are welcome to attend this free workshop, which takes place via Zoom on **May 24 from 2-4 p.m**.

In addition to the model presentation, attendees will hear from several speakers offering their local, regional, and statewide perspectives on the benefits of buffers and how the model can be incorporated at the local level.
